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Recognize what you know matters

While in the online classroom don't shy away from answering questions, especially when called upon by the teacher to answer a question.






Share your ideas

When teachers ask questions about a topic, it's always important for you to feel that sharing your ideas is always welcome. So go ahead, and share your ideas on the topic with the class and add insight that everyone can appreciate!





Set goals (for your learning)

Share your goals with your teacher

Speak up and ask questions

Ask questions when you don't understand what the teacher has explained. But be sure to tell the teacher what part you don't understand. It is not enough to just say, "I don't understand."

The teacher will be better able to help you when are more specific in your request.





It's OK to ask questions

By asking a question you are participating in class the right way. Plus, you may be asking a question that someone else may not have thought to ask, but it helped that you asked the question!





Answer Questions

If you get the chance to answer another student's question, you are helping that student understand the topic, and are helping yourself in becoming more confident in understanding the topic.



≡ Be polite!

Sometimes students will make mistakes in answering a question in class. If you can help by giving the correct answer, remember to be polite in how you respond.

The way you respond can either make the other student feel good for understanding where they went wrong, or feel bad for making the mistake, so remember to choose your words carefully!





Offer to help



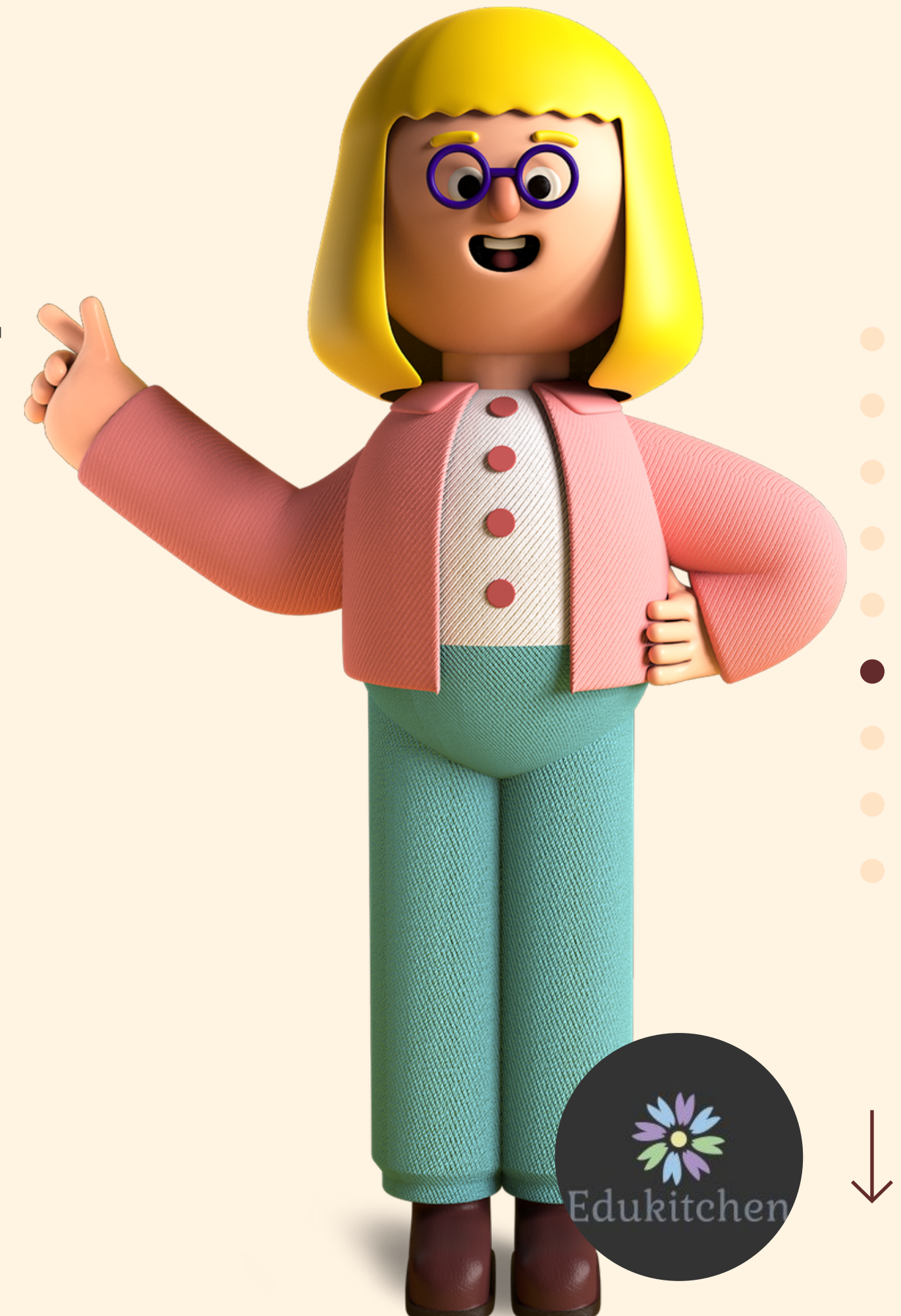
In the online classroom, activities will look a little different and so your teacher is looking for those students who are willing to get the activity started, so be that student!
